- Jackpot Pre-Entry Fee: \$25; Jackpot Late Entry Fee: \$35
- Open Show Class Pre-Entry Fee: \$8; Open Show Class Late Entry Fee: \$12
- No Refund Policy. All entries are final.
- Exhibitors may enter classes and check in throughout the day. After 8 a.m. all entries and payments must be completed through the **Showman App**. To compete in a class, exhibitors must be entered and checked in at least **FIVE** classes prior to that class. No gate entries will be permitted.
- **All** check-in will take place at the horse announcer's stand east of the arena.
- Early Entry Fee rate will close Thursday, July 30th at 11:59 p.m. (Late Entry will apply after Thursday)
- McLean County 4-H Exhibitors will receive 50% of their registration fee back, if registered in advance online by Tuesday, July 28th at 11:59 p.m. *Note* Exhibitor **must** have checked in to the 4-H show to be eligible for 50% back on their entry fee and **50% back does NOT apply to jackpot classes**)
- Stall space limited, exhibitors will be allowed to show off trailers – generators encouraged.
- W-9 Paperwork may need to be completed.
- Open to **all** ages.

Illinois Equine

1. All horses and other Equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
3. An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trailride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

Out-of-State Equine

1. All horses and other Equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
3. All horses and other Equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

Horse Show Rules

- The Premier Livestock Classic Horse Show is not a member of USEF, POA, or AQHA; however, this show will use these organization's rulebooks as a GUIDE.
- Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their area by their stall neat and clean, including the wash rack after use. No off-rack bathing of animals. Animals must be bathed in designated wash area only. Please keep the wash rack area clean!
- Exhibitors must have current original or photocopy of negative Coggins Test for each animal at check-in and be kept by the exhibitor at the grounds at all times.
- Exhibitor must lead horse from barn to designated mounting area.
- Exhibitors may show in **both** a Western Pleasure and a Ranch Horse Pleasure class.
- Walk-Trot exhibitors may elect to show holding the reins with two hands, regardless of the age of the horse.
- SEI-ASTM labeled approved helmet (inspected at check-in) with harness affixed, will be required for all riders 21 years of age and under. Boots with heels, helmets, and long pants/breeches, will be required for all exhibitors while mounted.
- Jump vests are acceptable during any jumping classes.
- Classes may be combined or deleted at Horse Director's discretion.
- All decisions of the judges are final. Questions must be directed to the superintendent in charge that day. They may decide whether to approach the judge with question. Exhibitors and parents should NOT question the judge without the superintendent or Show Director present.
- You may **NOT** cross enter walk trot and walk trot canter lope, horsemanship, or equation classes. Can **NOT** cross enter the walk trot & 3 gait, **EXCEPT** for the jackpot classes.
- Arena will be to ride in before the start of the show and during the lunch break
- The Premier Livestock Show Committee and Directors reserves the right to make any final decisions on the rules and settle any disputes.
